OFC Report - Joanne

The OFC board met on Tuesday Dec 11/12 by teleconference. We were one member short of a quorum, but went through the agenda.

10/12/2012

- 1. We are still waiting for word from CGSB on how much they will contribute to Standards Maintenance.
- 2. COABC has invited OFC to hold the face to face AGM at the conference in Vernon, FEB 22-24, 2013. We have accepted, and will meet just before or just after the COABC conference
- 3. Nicole Boudreau, our ED met with a representative of CEC (The Commission for Environmental Cooperation. It is an organization that spans three countries—Canada, US and Mexico and operates a trilingual website.
- 4. The Organic Science Cluster, the new one beginning in 2013, has conditionally accepted 50 projects to research over the next three years. It is now operating out of Dalhousie U, rather than Nova Scotia Agricultural College.
- 5. LLP consultation is still going on. It is a nightmare to control this contamination as the GMO's can be in containers coming from outside Canada and be transferred to whatever it goes in there.

- 6. Andrew Peregrine, a researcher at OACC has been working with sheep under conventional and organic regimes. All drugs that have been used in conventional regimes with sheep are showing resistance to the organisms, but he has found that sheep raised organically are doing very well. The OACC will make the paper more concise and send it to the Western Producer soon, then it will be posted on the OACC site.
- 7. The Brand Names List with Peppersoft. Ecocert and Procert are willing to share lists. OMRI wants to be a consultant, but other CB's are protecting their lists.
- 8. The CB's have requested the COO to shorten the comment period on questions about the Standards from 60 days to 30.
- 9. Should OFC be registered as a lobbyist? Probably no, we would have to pay someone to do it.
- 10. Most important thing on agenda—letter from OFC to CSTA Canadian Seed Trade Alliance (Patty Townsend) and Forage Genetics http://www.foragegenetics.com/--- about our concerns about the release of GE Alfalfa. http://cdnseed.org/

AIAC – Shiela (to be updated once I receive a digital report from Shiela)

- CAAP/YAA funded project (Food system design); opportunities for goofy participation
- Grazing lease holders access to GF2 funding (best management practices)
- Discussion on getting mobile abattoir up and running don't give up!
- GF2 looking at ways to ensure equitable review of applications
- Meat infrastructure group not going to come back for waste mgmt, so Tom and Kevin will spearhead new smaller group to look at this
